Centrale Nantes: 4th global performer on student mobility (U-Multirank)

For the fifth year in a row, Centrale Nantes stands out in the U-Multirank ranking for international orientation, ranking 4th on the list of the 25 world's best performing institutions on student mobility (Global Top 25 universities for student mobility). This marks an improvement of two places compared to 2019. 22 institutions in this top 25 are European.

Centrale Nantes - with 16 A scores across 29 indicators assessed - is one of four top performing institutions in France in the 2020 ranking alongside Télécom Paris (18 A scores), IMT Atlantique (16 A scores) and Montpellier Sup Agro (16 A scores).

Centrale Nantes stood out in four categories:

- International orientation: Six As on six indicators
- Knowledge transfer: Five As on seven indicators
- Research: Three As on seven indicators
- Teaching and Learning: two As on four indicators

What are the criteria used to evaluate international orientation?

Having an international student body and offering students the opportunity to undertake part of their degree programme abroad is an indication of the international orientation of a university. In order to provide a full picture of mobility and international exchange U-Multirank takes account of both incoming and outgoing mobility

U-Multirank is the first world ranking for higher education establishments with performance assessed on an A to E scale according to a plethora of (29) indicators and five categories: teaching and learning, research, knowledge transfer, international orientation and regional engagement. The 2020 ranking includes 1759 higher education establishments, including 52 in France.
