The Board of Governors at Centrale Nantes takes a step towards a successful Nantes I-SITE and building a new experimental institution

Meeting on 3 June, the Board of Governors at Centrale Nantes voted in favour of creating an experimental institution with the I-SITE's founding members, (within the scope of the order n° 2018-1131 of 12 December 2018), in which Centrale Nantes, as a component institution, would have a remit to federate engineering.

The board reaffirmed its support for an institution based on an ambitious project that affirms certain values: to play an active role in ecological and solidarity transition, to place Nantes firmly on the global map, in particular, and to engage in an interdisciplinary approach with a focus on priority areas such as health, industry of the future and ocean engineering.

The Board of Governors agreed that the statutes of the experimental institution should guarantee that Centrale Nantes fully exercise the prerogatives of its moral and legal personality.

These strategic directions will guide the Board of Governors in selecting the school's new director who will have responsibility for taking the project forward. The recruitment process is ongoing. On 17 June, the Board of Governors will draw up a shortlist of candidates to be interviewed on 2 July. A debate will be held on 3 July, followed by a vote, the results of which will then be forwarded to the Ministry of Higher Education, Research and Innovation.
